In Parsha Haazinu—we “read” or “sing”! the song that Moses came and spoke in the ears of the people. Moses’ beautiful song is words of life told to all Israel to put in their hearts, “as witness against you today—that you may command your children to keep and do all the words of this Torah” (Deut. 32:46). *L’ dor v’dor*, from generation to generation! It is his song on the last day of his earthly life. How poignant and even fragrant it is to hear this song today!! In the week after *Shabbat Shuvah*, the Sabbath of Return, and coming just after the feasts and fasts of the High Holidays which end in Yom Kippur.

On a personal note, I feel these words so close. The song speaks of how God’s children will go away from Him and return to Him. As in the words of this week’s Haftarah, I was one who “ignored and forget The Rock who birthed me” for most of my adult life until my “return”. I was found when I was not even seeking Him, He became visible to me who didn’t even ask for Him (Romans 10:20, Isaiah 65:1). The LORD saw it all, His words are in hearing distance of “all who have ears to hear”. It was His plan even before the Creation to set into place a Deliverer who would atone for our sins and bring us back to Him. May our children and loved ones know “Our Rock”. May they abide in the true vine Yeshua and know He is the Resurrection and Life (John 11:25)!! Let us all sing His praises in this season of *Teshuvah* (Return). For our families, for all of Israel, May we hear the song of the Torah, and the voice of the Bridegroom, with prayers that all return, be healed and be saved!
